STAVEREN B.V. AND THE BINGO 16-Z CLASSIC

“Quality and sustainability”

The charm of family businesses is the usually long history, that spans several generations. This is also true for Isolatiebedrijf C.J. van Staveren B.V., founded in 1980. Staveren B.V. is one of the most prominent nationally active insulation companies in the Netherlands, with projects in commercial construction (offices and data centres), ship-building (such as LNG vessels) as well as in the offshore and petrochemical industries. In addition, the company offers a complete package with around sixty employees: from insulation and scaffolding to coatings and fire protection applications.

Managing director Joey van Staveren (34) is the third generation in the family business. He started in the precast/sheet metal department at the age of 16 and will take over the company in due course. Father Coen van Staveren chairman of the board, will celebrate his fiftieth anniversary next year. Besides the Van Staveren family, there is another constant factor in the company's almost 45-year history; MABI has been at the heart of the precast and sheet metal department from the very beginning to its complete satisfaction.

The old MABI Bingo 16

Joey van Staveren says: “I remember my father and my brother Wesley taking me to EuroBlech in Haover in 1994 when I was seven years old. We went there with the aim of getting an impression of the MABI Bingo 16, which had just been launched on the market. The MABI-consultant Tore Schumann emphasised the qualities of the machine and so we became the first company in the Netherlands with a MABI Bingo 16. Finally this machine has been running and producing smoothly in our workshop for 28 years, with the exception of two repairs. There have been almost no problems and/or breakdowns, and if something did occur, we were usually able to solve it ourselves with telephone support from MABI. You want to be able to rely on a machine and MABI has never let us down.”

Replacement

After almost three decades, the old MABI Bingo 16 was starting to show signs of wear. Replacing parts became more difficult and the software was no longer up to date. We had to make a decision. Joey van Staveren: “With a steady increase in orders, we run a high production, and comprehensive prefabrication and sheet metal work. You shouldn't risk production coming to a standstill because of a machine breakdown. You want and have to avoid that at all costs!”

Quality and Sustainability

Around 400 copies of the MABI Bingo 16, launched in 1994, are still running worldwide. This period is extremely long for a production machine and says a lot about the quality and longevity with which MABI machines are produced. Joey van Staveren: “A MABI machine is the top and you can't get any higher than the top”.

Seamless transition to the MABI Bingo 16-Z Classic

The precast/sheet metal workers at Staveren B.V. can handle the MABI Bingo 16 blindly thanks to their years of experience, and this is also the case with the new version, the MABI Bingo 16-Z Classic. “The mechanics of the new generation are more or less the same. Only new software and some minor changes to the housing show that we are dealing with the new generation of the MABI Bingo 16-Z Classic. The technology has proven itself - so it was an almost seamless transition for us. With the new software and a new look, the old comes out in the new. We switched on the previous machine in 1994 and switched it off for the last time a few months ago. We therefore deliberately chose the same type of machine. The MABI Bingo 16-Z Classic fits perfectly into our company and workshop. We expect to have no problems with this machine for the next 28 years.” After these 28 years, the fourth generation of Van Staveren will most likely be at the helm. “But I will put in a good word about MABI,” Joey van Staveren says with a smile. “I can't imagine that MABI and Van Staveren won't to work together on a good future after 2050.”
